A representative from your school is asked to call the Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic Tournament Headquarters at 502-783-2159 or 502-783-2179 on Sunday, January 22, 2012, with the information outlined below. The following call schedule has been established for your region.

Information Needed:

1. ARRIVAL DATE AND TIME (EST)

Upon arrival at the hotel, your Regional Representative, _____, will meet your team. Therefore, it will be necessary to know what day you are traveling to Frankfort and the approximate time you anticipate arriving at your hotel. This arrival date and time will be conveyed to your hotel. Upon arrival, your Regional Representative will have the Participant Passes for your team.

2. DURATION OF STAY

We need to know your plans to stay in Frankfort should you win or lose. This information will be helpful in confirming reservations with the hotels.

3. TEAM ROOMING LIST

As indicated in the hotel section of this information book, the Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic requires a rooming list and the hotel requires a copy of your tax-exempt certificate at check-in. The rooming list is due via e-mail prior to noon on Sunday, January 22nd. The e-mail address is allaclassic@windstream.net

TICKET INFORMATION

Opening Round Games

Enclosed in your packet are 350 tickets for your first round game. These tickets are to be sold for \$8 each to students, fans, band, or anyone not covered with a participant pass that will be attending the game and would like to sit in your cheering section. The seats are general admission within your assigned section and fans must sit in their assigned section.

Your Regional Representative will ask your Principal or designated ticket person to sign a consignment form that indicates the number of tickets received and will be used when reconciling tickets and money. Unsold tickets and ticket receipts should be returned to Gary Munsie in the Headquarters Room located on the lower level of the Frankfort Convention Center at least one hour before tip-off of your game or earlier if possible for reconciliation. Checks should be made payable to Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic.

Subsequent Rounds

Since there is a day between rounds in the Girls' Tournament, after the girls' first session ONLY, schools with participating girls' teams will be allowed to take tickets on consignment to sell at school. Unsold tickets and ticket receipts should be returned to Gary Munsie and reconciled. For all subsequent girls' rounds and all boys' rounds, tickets will be sold in the lobby of the Frankfort Convention Center immediately following the game for \$8 each. Tickets purchased at the Frankfort Convention Center regular ticket windows will sold for \$10 each. The ticket is good for all games in the session.

With the exception of the girl's first round, each principal or school representative handling tickets should bring a check to purchase the number of tickets needed for their next round game. No refunds will be given, therefore, it is important that you purchase no more tickets than you are sure you can sell or need for school personnel. You should proceed to the advance ticket sales area immediately following your victory to purchase these tickets. The Frankfort Convention Center ticket manager is in charge of this advance sale of tickets. The remaining seats in your assigned section will be put on immediate sale.

TEAM INFORMATION

Participant Passes

Twenty-five (25) participant passes per team are available from your Regional Representative upon arrival at the hotel. Distribution of these passes is left to the discretion of the school administration. These passes are good for all sessions with seating available in Section 20 of the Frankfort Convention Center. All teams arriving at the Frankfort Convention Center to play or watch during any session should enter through the pass gate located on the east side of the arena. Upon entry each participant pass will be hole-punched and reentry during that session is not permissible.

Cheerleaders

Cheerleaders are not required to have a participant pass to be admitted to the session in which their team is participating. However, they must be in uniform and enter through the east pass gate of the Frankfort Convention Center. During sessions when their teams are not participating, cheerleaders are required to have a ticket and must enter through the regular admission ticket gates. Sponsors are required to have a participant pass.

There is a maximum of sixteen (16) cheerleaders who may be in uniform and participating during any tournament game not including the team mascot. This limit is observed whether or not the squad is competing in the in-game cheerleading competition. Non uniformed cheerleaders and other adults, including bus drivers, traveling with the squad will not be entitled to pass gate entry and are required to have a ticket for that session.

Bands

All band members including directors, chaperones, and bus drivers are required to have tickets for entry into the Frankfort Convention Center. Bands must sit at the uppermost part of their assigned seating sections. Electrical musical instruments and amplifiers are not permitted to be used in the Frankfort Convention Center. No exceptions will be made.

Locker Rooms

Locker rooms will be designated for each game. You are responsible for the condition of the room. A key will be given to the head coach upon arrival at the Frankfort Convention Center and should be returned immediately following the conclusion of your game. Please do not leave valuables in the locker room.

Uniforms

The team listed on top of each bracket will be the home team and should wear light colored uniforms. The team listed on the bottom of each bracket is the visiting team and should wear dark uniforms.

Team Bench

Each team may dress a maximum of fifteen (15) players per contest. The total number of bench personnel (including head coach, assistant coaches, managers, trainer, non-dressing members) shall not exceed the maximum of 20. The team bench will consist of twenty (20) chairs only and none will be added. The home team will be seated to the left of the official scorer while the visiting team will be seated to the right of the official scorer.

Line-up Card

Line-up cards should be returned to your team coordinator as soon as possible. Do not turn line-up cards in to the official scorer.

Game Ball

The game ball for the 2012 Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic will be Rawlings.

Towels

Teams will be required to furnish their own towels.

Warm-up Time

The warm-up time for each game will be twenty (20) minutes. Teams will be escorted to the game floor by their team coordinator. Teams must warm up at the opposite end of the floor from their team bench. No dunking is permitted during warm-ups.

Halftime

Each halftime will be ten (10) minutes in length. Teams will be notified to return from their locker rooms three (3) minutes before the end of halftime.

Press

Media requests should be made via e-mail to allaclassic@windstream.net

School Media

Your school may request one media pass for your school newspaper or yearbook for the session in which your team is participating. This request must be completed in advance by e-mail to allaclassic@windstream.net

Filming

Audio and video recorders are allowed in designated areas. Consult your team coordinator for these locations. No electrical outlets will be available so individuals videotaping should bring batteries. Fans with video recorders must not obstruct the view of any fan or participant.

Training Staff

The Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic through the Frankfort Convention Center will provide a trainer for all contests. Please make your needs known as early as possible so that all student athletes have the opportunity for treatment.

Stats

The Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic will provide an official scorer for all contests in the tournament. W L Stats will be providing stats for each game of the 2012 tournament. One seat will be available for each team at the scorer's table for either stats or scorebook. Due to limited space no exceptions will be made.

Cutting Down of Nets

The champions of the 2012 Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic are to not begin the cutting down of nets until the awards ceremony has been completed.

HOTEL INFORMATION

LODGING

Ten (10) rooms have been reserved for your team. Since each team is responsible to pay their own expenses, hotels will require each school to present their tax-exempt certificate upon check-in. The Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic will reimburse each school for up to four nights at the rate listed on the confirmed e-mail team hotel sheet. Individual schools are responsible for rooming costs above this amount.

Each hotel requires a rooming list submitted to the All "A" Classic in advance and your tax-exempt certificate upon arrival. Please e-mail the rooming list to allaclassic@windstream.net by noon on Sunday, January 22nd. Rooming lists **must** be submitted to the All "A" Classic before the hotel assignment can be made. Rooming lists not e-mailed to the All "A" Classic by the deadline may result in the release of your block of rooms and loss of reimbursement for lodging. Tournament Officials will contact each hotel after your e-mail notification and inform them of your arrival date and time along with the rooming list.

2012 Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic Basketball Tournament Fact Sheet

- The Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic is a statewide basketball tournament for the smallest 125 high schools within the Commonwealth of Kentucky. This is based on student enrollment for grades 9 - 12 as verified through Kentucky Department of Education records on October 1st of each year. The winners from the 16 boys' regional tournaments along with the 16 girls' regional tournament champions will advance to the statewide tournament held in Frankfort from January 25 - January 29.
- The purpose of the basketball tournament is to allow smaller high schools in Kentucky an opportunity to compete in basketball on a more equal basis, to showcase the athletes from smaller schools who sometimes do not get the same recognition as athletes from the larger high schools, and to offer the people of Kentucky another opportunity to enjoy quality basketball.
- The Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic is not only a basketball tournament, but also a full program for the smaller schools. In 2011-2012, the All "A" Classic will provide over 15,000 smaller school students with the opportunity to actively participate in a scholarship program, an art competition, statewide baseball tournament, statewide fast pitch softball tournament, statewide volleyball tournament, and a cheerleading competition.
- The Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic strengthened its commitment to academics and education in 1996-97 by providing scholarship opportunities open to all students of Class "A" schools. In the first year of the scholarship program, twelve \$1,000 scholarships were awarded to Class "A" seniors planning to attend any Kentucky institution of higher education. The number of scholarships increased to a total of \$83,000 for 2010-2011. In addition, scholarships are awarded as part of the statewide art competition. This year the total amount of scholarships provided will exceed \$1,000,000.

2012 Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic Basketball Tournament Fact Sheet

- Of the 126 Class "A" schools that are members of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association, 124 boys' teams and 125 girls' teams committed to participate in this year's Touchstone Energy All "A" Basketball Classic.
- In 2011 over 34,000 fans attended the tournament. The Owensboro Catholic Lady Aces defeated the Lady Falcons of Monroe County 65-60 to capture the girls' championship and the Betsy Layne Bobcats downed the DeSales Colts 44-41 to capture the boys' statewide championship on February 6.
- The organizing agency for the tournament is the Kentucky All "A" Classic, Incorporated. The tournament is hosted by the Frankfort Convention Center and the City of Frankfort. Tournament funding is provided by Touchstone Energy and the Kentucky All "A" Classic, Incorporated. Funds are generated through donations and ticket sales.
- Tickets for specific sessions can be purchased on game day for \$10.00 each at the ticket windows of Frankfort Convention Center. Questions regarding tickets or other information should be directed to Mike Reeves at 606-688-0291.

CHEERLEADING COMPETITION

Who is the competition for?

The cheerleading squads of all 32 teams participating in the Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic.

What are the eligibility requirements?

All cheerleaders who meet the eligibility guidelines and covered by the catastrophic insurance policy as outlined in the KHSAA Handbook. A maximum of sixteen (16) cheerleaders may be in uniform and participate during any tournament game not including the mascot.

Where and when will the competition be held?

"In-game" competition will be judged during the first round of the Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic State Tournament on Wednesday and Thursday. Winners of the cheerleading competition will be announced during the third game of the Friday night session.

Must we register in advance?

Yes. Please e-mail allaclassic@windstream.net by no later than 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 24th to confirm your attendance at the event. A roster should also be included in this correspondence.

Are there awards?

Trophies will be awarded for first, second, and third places in both girls' and boys' divisions.

What about props?

Props such as flags, etc. that may potentially obstruct crowd view may not be used during the game, and must be kept out of the arena floor area while the game is in progress.

CHEERLEADING INFORMATION SHEET

- ◆ Cheerleaders are not required to have a participant pass for a session in which their team is participating. However, they must be in uniform and enter through the east pass gate of the Frankfort Convention Center. There is a maximum of sixteen (16) cheerleaders who may be in uniform and participating during any tournament game not including the mascot. Cheer coaches are required to have participant passes to enter through the pass gate. Non-uniformed cheerleaders, the bus driver, and other adults traveling with the squad will not be entitled to pass gate entry. Cheerleaders must have a ticket or participant pass to enter when their team is not participating.
- ◆ Each cheerleading sponsor should check-in at the cheerleading table at least 30 minutes prior to their first game to receive further instructions on competition guidelines. Cheer coaches are required to have a participant pass for entry and floor access.
- ◆ Cheerleading squads must cheer in their designated area of the Farnham Dudgeon Civic Center. The home team cheerleader area will be on the west end of the floor nearest their bench. The visiting team cheerleader area will be on the east end of the floor nearest their bench. Any violation of this requirement will result in disqualification of the squad.
- ◆ The floor cheer time limit is 90 seconds and must be performed at the beginning of halftime as directed by All "A" Classic personnel.
- ◆ Safety rules will be KAPOS enforced. All cheerleading squads will be held to the limits regarding number of competitors and regarding the performance of stunts within the National Federation Spirit Guidelines.
- ◆ Awards will be given to first, second, third place winners in both the girls' and boys' divisions.
- ◆ Only hand-held sign and banners may be used. Balloons are not permitted in the Frankfort Convention Center.

All "A" Radio Network

Once again, the Touchstone Energy All "A" Classic will provide a tournament radio network. Due to the large number of games scheduled during the five-day period, a team of veteran sports announcers has been assembled to provide play-by-play. Radio stations throughout the state may arrange to carry the network broadcast of individual games or the entire tournament. No broadcast fees will be charged for network affiliates.

Cost to participating stations will be \$1.00 for the first minute and \$0.75 for each additional minute. An average one hour forty-five minute broadcast will cost approximately \$80. The network format will allow twenty-four (24) 30-second spots per game available for local sale. 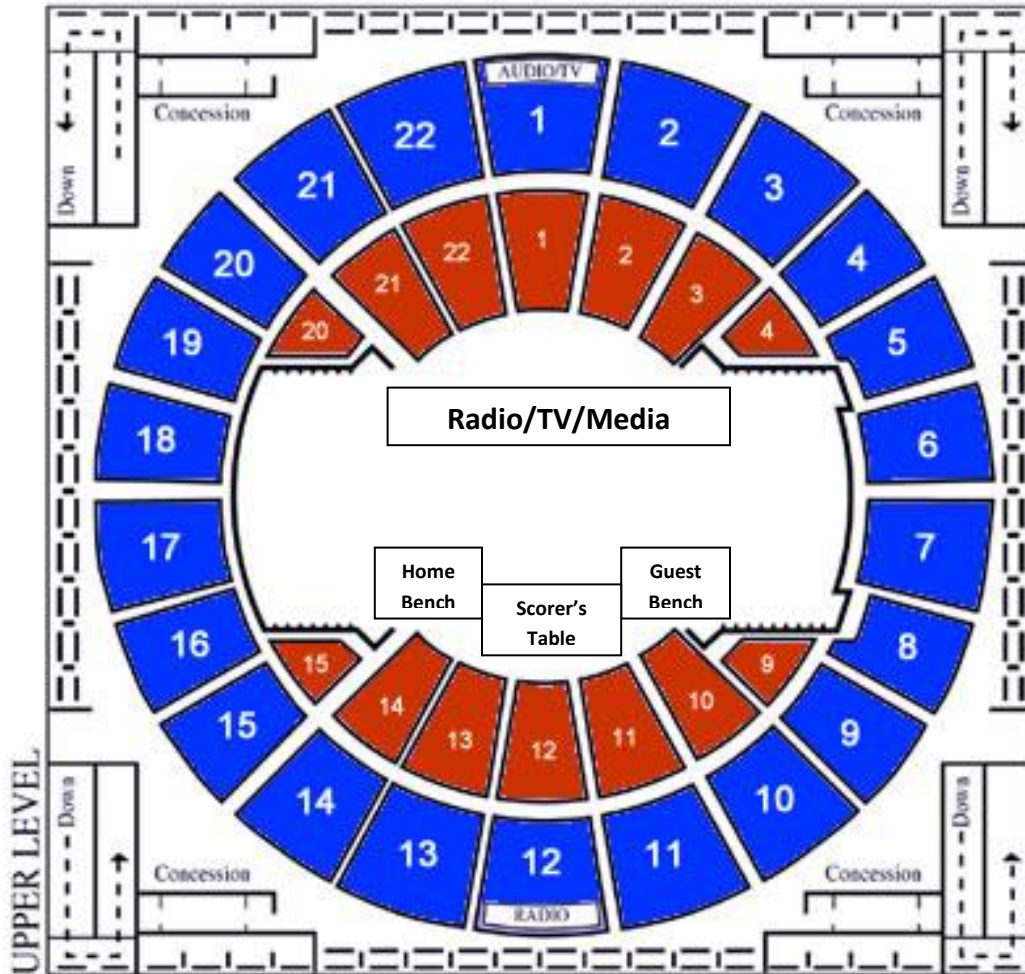
Please note that schools or parents "on the road" may also access the network feed by phone, anywhere in the United States.

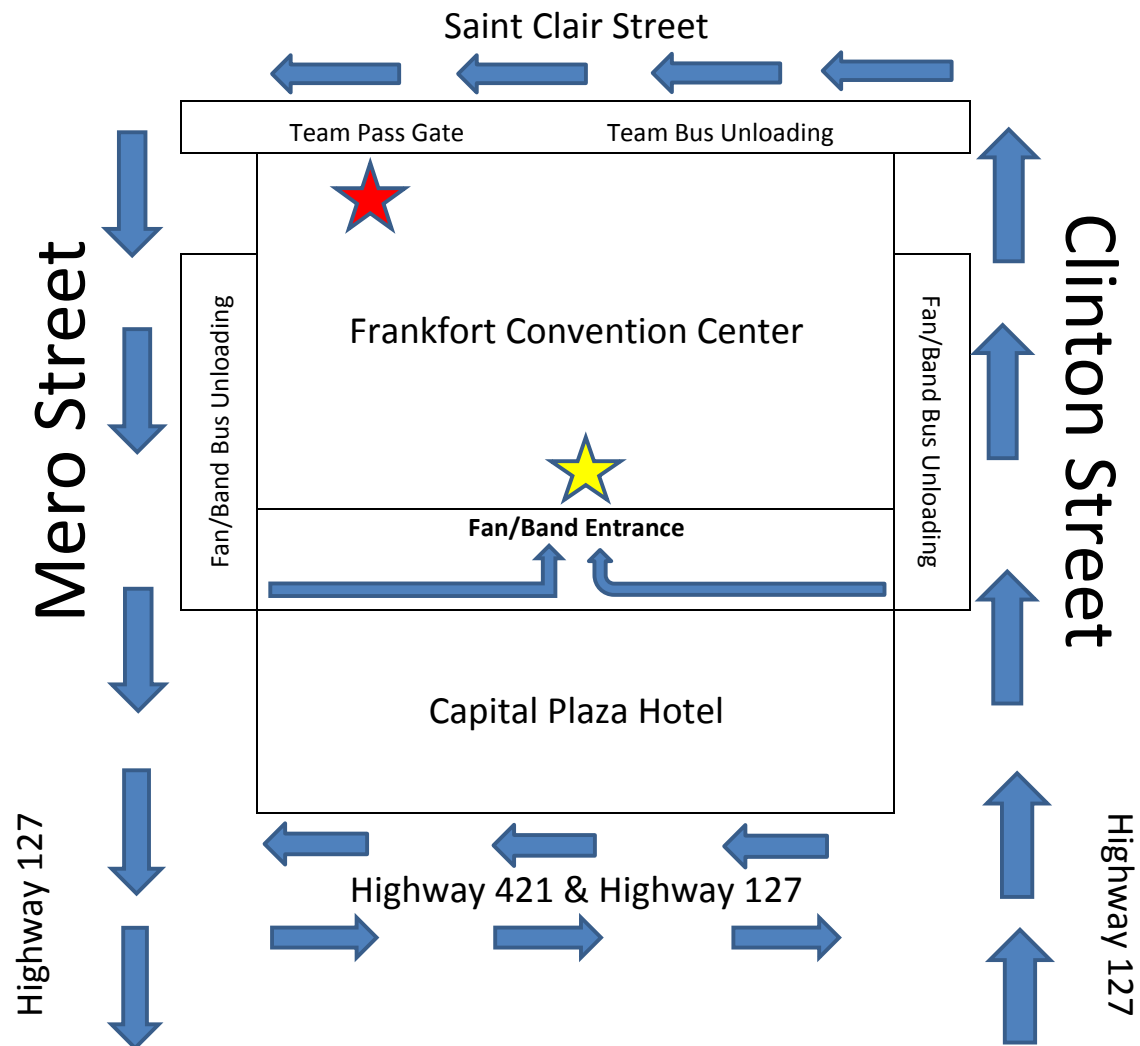
