Statewide Competitions Entry Fee

There is no charge for any statewide competition. The \$200 annual fee covers all statewide events. All regional competitions are governed locally and may charge an entry fee if a majority of the schools in that region vote to do so.

Golf Competition

The golf tournament is divided into regional and statewide competitions. The regional alignment is the same as the basketball alignment, not the KHSAA alignment. Regional competitions, which must be completed by August 31, are managed on the local level with the top girls' and top boys' team (maximum of five players) advancing to Somerset. The top two golfers, both boys and girls, not on the winning team also qualify for the statewide competition. Substitutions are permitted up to one hour prior of scheduled statewide tournament tee start time.

The statewide competition is scheduled for September 7. Boys will play at Eagle's Nest and girls at Woodson Bend in Somerset. The top three teams will receive player medallions with the champion and runner-up each receiving a team plaque. The top three individual players will also receive awards. No travel expenses for golf are reimbursed by the All "A" Classic.

Volleyball

The volleyball competition is divided into two levels: regional and statewide. Regional tournaments must be completed by September 8th and are controlled locally with all 16 regional champions advancing to the statewide tournament. The pool play/single elimination tournament event will be held September 14 at Mid-America Volleyball Center in Jeffersontown.

Soccer Competition

The soccer competition is divided into three levels: regional, sectional, and statewide. Regional tournaments and sectionals are controlled locally. Sectionals featuring the winners of two regions must be completed by September 22nd. The single-elimination statewide tournament is held on the fourth weekend in September, which is the 28th and 29th this year, at the Elizabethtown Sports Park. The quarterfinal and semifinal round games are played on Saturday with finals held on Sunday.

Scholarship Competition

The scholarship competition is an individual event with each winner receiving a \$1,000 scholarship which can be used at any post-secondary institution within the state of Kentucky. During 2012-2013 a total of 93 students received scholarships with the same number expected in 2013-2014.

The first step in the process is to submit an application which is due by December 7th. The application is available online at the organization's website www.allaclassic.org. Immediately following the December 7th deadline, approximately 130 finalists are chosen to be interviewed on January 4th at Kentucky State University in Frankfort. Each finalist will receive a personal invitation noting their interview time.

Winners are notified within a few days after the interviews are conducted with each winner expected to attend the Statewide Awards Banquet held on Saturday of the statewide basketball tournament.

Basketball Competition

The basketball competition is divided into two competitions: regional and statewide. Regional tournaments are played from January 13 and January 25 with the winner in each region advancing to the statewide tournament at the Frankfort Convention Center. The 2014 tournaments will be held from January 29 through February 2.

The winning teams in each region are provided ten rooms each night for four nights at an assigned hotel in Frankfort. Teams are urged to stay regardless of wins or losses in the tournament. While in Frankfort each team receives a meal allowance of \$150 per day.

Baseball Competition

The baseball competition is divided into three levels: regional, sectional, and statewide. Regional tournaments are controlled locally. The sectional features the winners of two regions and must be completed by April 26. The single-elimination statewide tournament is held on the first weekend in May, which is the 3rd and 4th in 2014, at Whitaker Bank Ballpark in Lexington. The first round games are played on Saturday with semifinals and finals held on Sunday.

The winning teams from each sectional are provided four rooms for two nights at an assigned hotel in Lexington. Teams are urged to stay regardless of wins or losses in the tournament.

Fast-Pitch Softball Competition

The fast-pitch softball competition is divided into two levels: regional and statewide. Regional tournaments must be completed by April 20th and are controlled locally with all 16 regional champions advancing to the statewide tournament. The statewide tournament is held on the last weekend in April, April 26th and April 27th in 2014, at Jack Fisher Park in Owensboro. The format for the statewide tournament is pool play followed by an eight-team single elimination tournament. Games are played on Saturday and Sunday.

The winning teams from each region are provided four rooms for two nights at an assigned hotel in Owensboro. Teams are urged to stay regardless of wins or losses in the tournament.
