Statewide Competitions Entry Fee

There is no charge for any statewide competition with the exception of archery. The \$200 annual fee covers all statewide events. All regional competitions are governed locally and may charge an entry fee if a majority of the schools in that region vote to do so.

Scholarship Competition

The scholarship competition is an individual event with each winner receiving a \$1,000 scholarship which can be used at any post-secondary institution within the state of Kentucky. During 2024-2025 approximately 100 students will receive scholarships.

The first step in the process is to submit an application which is due by February 8th. The application is available online at the organization's website www.allaclassic.org. Immediately following the deadline, approximately 140 finalists are chosen to be interviewed on March 29th at the Perkins Building on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University. Each finalist will receive a personal invitation noting their interview time.

Golf Competition

The golf tournament is divided into regional and statewide competitions. The regional alignment is the same as the All "A" Classic basketball alignment not the KHSAA alignment. Regional competitions are managed on the local level with the top girls' and top boys' team (maximum of five players) advancing to Richmond. The top two golfers, both boys and girls, not on the winning team also qualify for the statewide competition.

The 2024 statewide competition is scheduled for September 7 and September 8. Boys will play at Gibson Bay on September 7 and girls play on September 8 at Gibson Bay in Richmond. No travel expenses for golf are reimbursed by the All "A" Classic.

Volleyball

The volleyball competition is divided into two levels: regional and statewide. Regional tournaments are played during August and September and are controlled locally with all 16 regional champions advancing to the statewide tournament. The pool play and single elimination tournament event will be held September 20 and September 21 in Elizabethtown. The top two teams in each pool advance to the championship bracket while the third and fourth place teams in each pool advance to the consolation bracket. No travel expenses for volleyball are reimbursed by the All "A" Classic.

Soccer Competition

The soccer competition is divided into three levels: regional, sectional, and statewide. Regional tournaments are played during August and September and are controlled locally. The sectional, featuring two regional winners, is scheduled for September 15 with odd-numbered regional champions hosting in 2024-2025. The single-elimination statewide tournament is scheduled for September 21 and September 22 in Louisville. Quarterfinal and semifinal matches are played on Saturday with both the girls' and boys' statewide championships played on Sunday. No travel expenses for soccer are reimbursed by the All "A" Classic.

Basketball Competition

The basketball competition is divided into two competitions: regional and statewide. Regional tournaments will be completed by January 18th with the winner in each region advancing to the statewide tournament. The 2024-2025 tournaments will be held from January 22 through January 26 at the Owensboro Sportscenter.

The winning teams in each region are provided eight rooms each night for up to four nights at an assigned hotel in the host city. Each team receives a hotel reimbursement up to \$100 per night per room for up to eight rooms each night they are housed.

Archery Competition

The coed archery competition is divided into two levels: regional and statewide. Regional tournaments should be completed by February 8th for the 2024-2025 season. Each region can have two teams of 12 archers and two top archers not on a winning team. Teams are co-ed with no limit on the number of girls or boys on a team. Teams must be KHSAA approved or certified members. Each school can enter only one team in a regional. A region without two archery teams can send one team, 12 per team, along with the top five individuals not from the winning team. In this case the region can decide if they need to conduct a regional tournament. If the region has no team entries, then the top 10 individual archers advance to the statewide tournament. The cost for each archer at the statewide tournament is \$10.00. No travel expenses for archery are reimbursed by the All "A" Classic.

The baseball competition is divided into three levels: regional, sectional, and statewide. Regional tournaments are played in March and April and are controlled locally. The single-elimination statewide tournament is scheduled for April 26 and April 27 at Daviess County High School in Owensboro. The winning teams from each sectional will be reimbursed for up to four rooms Friday night and up to four rooms for Saturday night at a hotel in the host city. The reimbursement is up to \$100 per night per room.
